Beginning earlier this year the church hosted two Sacred Conversations, attended by a large portion of the congregation. We focused on values of our church.

The values that were expressed in these gatherings were: Embracing Humanity: doing what Jesus did and where Jesus did it:

Open Canopy: embracing diverse humanity with welcome and acceptance;

Downtown Oriented: a church serving the heart of Springfield; Generosity: encouraging and equipping people to nurture their God given gifts and use them.

The next step was to ask a team of people to meet several times and "define" what we would DO if we wanted to be known by our values. This team of people thought deeply, had conversations with members of the congregation and with individuals in our community.

Together we have produced a "map" of actions for 2025 which will be a big focus of our energy. This map includes restructuring our existing policy. At the business meeting on October 16, we voted to suspend the Bylaws and Constitution

Simply the "LCT" will be suspended and restructured into 3 sections:

Standing Teams (those things that are ongoing and required for our church to function.
These include things like Sunday School leaders, Greeters and blowing the leaves from the
porch).

- Ad Hoc Teams (these will include leaders for each of the Action Steps, identified in the map referenced above. Each of these action steps will be discussed in Quarterly Business Meetings and we will include updates in upcoming newsletters.
- 3. An Administrative Leadership Team (ALT). this small team will help to guide the activities of the Ad Hoc Teams and be responsible for sharing progress with you. This team includes the elected Moderator, Vice Moderator, Treasurer, Benevolence Treasurer, and 2-3 at large appointments from the congregation by the Moderator.

Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering

Friends in Christ:

I am writing to encourage your giving to your last annual offering of the year, the Retired Ministers and Missionaries offering of our American Baptist Churches, USA.

The Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering, RMMO, as you know, supports MMBB's effort to support retirees or their surviving spouses with emergency assistance when needs outdistance resources. Each retiree or surviving spouse also receives a "Thank you" check each November. Mine arrives each year just in time to meet expenses in the latter half of each November. So, thank you very much for your gifts to this offering last year.

I mentioned above the support this offering assists in providing emergency assistance when needs outdistance resources. Here is an example: about 15-16 years ago, MMBB member retirees who were able and interested, were given the opportunity to visit, either by telephone, or, preferably, if possible, in person. My wife, Macbeth and I made these visits in Central and Southern Illinois as well as several members who lived across the whole of Missouri. In our travels, I recall one person who spoke with us about the stresses on their income that year. The person was very concerned about how their ability to cover their expenses would be impacted by the annual adjustment to the monthly annuity payout they would receive the following year. Our gifts to RMMO each year help provide help for those in circumstances like this. This is the significance our gifts to "RMMO 2024" will have for many.

So, again, thank you for your past support and your consideration of the gift you can make this year. Thank you all for your thoughtfulness in this matter.

Graham Mart

The 9th annual Graham School Christmas Mart will be held in Merriam Hall on December 14 this year. In case you don't know about the Mart, here is a quick synopsis.

The Christmas Mart is basically a store, set up for one day, for parents of Graham School to select gifts for their children for Christmas. (We have an inventory worth about \$35,000. We don't spend that much though. The items for the Mart are purchased throughout the year at clearance sales and stored at the church until the big day. Monetary donations are always welcome.)

The parents purchase a \$5 voucher at the school which allows them to shop. That money stays with the school for special projects. They bring the voucher to the church and a personal shopper helps them choose a gift from four categories: A WANT (toy), a WEAR (clothes, coats), a NEED (pajamas, slippers, pillows, etc.) and a READ (book). Parents are given wrapping paper and bows and take the gifts home with them. For some parents, this is the only way they can obtain gifts for their children. We serve about 200 children from Graham and when the Mart is done, items that are left are distributed to other worthy organizations.

Many volunteers are needed to make this event happen. Most of the teachers at Graham help on this day—some of them have been doing it for 9 years. Some Central members have also been volunteering for 9 years.

Volunteers are needed for the following positions: Personal shopper, merchandise restocker, parking lot attendant, carry-out help and hospitality. Volunteers will be needed from 8:30 am to Noon. You can work the entire time or an hour or two. There is a sign-up sheet in the Welcome Center, or you can call Sharon Smith at 217-416-8047.

This is our way of blessing the families of Graham Elementary School.
